Mon 3:15 **Won't you be my Neighbor?** – This documentary explores the life, lessons, and legacy of iconic children's television host, Fred Rogers (2018) PG-13 1 hr 35 minutes

Mon 9:15 **Brother Outsider** – Documentary on the life and times of Quaker Bayard Rustin one of the leaders behind the non-violent protests of the civil rights era and one of the architects of the 1963 March on Washington. (2010) PG I hr. 30 min.

Tues 3:15 **A Dog's Way Home** - A female dog travels four hundred miles in search of her owner throughout a Colorado wilderness.(2019) 1 hr 36 min. PG

Tues 9:15 **BlacKkKlansman** - Ron Stallworth, an African American police officer from Colorado Springs, CO, successfully manages to infiltrate the local Ku Klux Klan branch with the help of a Jewish surrogate who eventually becomes its leader. (2018) R 2hrs 15min..

Wed 3:15 **Rest** No film. Take a nap.

Wed 9:15 **If Beale Street Could Talk** - A young woman embraces her pregnancy while she and her family set out to prove her childhood friend and lover innocent of a crime he didn't commit. (2018) R 1hr 59 min.

Thur 3:15 **Sweet Home Monteverde** (2019) Fed up with the rampant militarism and its inconsistency seemingly constant war a group of faithful Quakers from Alabama and Iowa made the conscious and conscientious decision to leave the US and move to Costa Rica to create a community organized around Quaker values. This film tells their story. Documentary 1 hr. 27 min.

Thur 9:15 **Spider-Man: into the Spider-verse** - Teen Miles Morales becomes Spider-Man of his reality, crossing his path with five counterparts from other dimensions to stop a threat for all realities. (2018) PG I hr 57 min.

Fri 3:15 **Tribal Justice** – A documentary of Two formidable Native American women, both chief judges in their tribe's courts, strive to reduce incarceration rates and heal their people by restoring rather than punishing offenders, modeling restorative justice in action. (2017) PG 1 hr. 27 min.

Fri 9:15 **Capernaum** - Capernaum ("Chaos") tells the story of Zain a Lebanese boy who sues his parents for the "crime" of giving him life. Capernaum follows Zain, a gutsy streetwise child as he flees his negligent parents, survives through his wits on the streets, and also takes care of 2 Ethiopian refugees. (2018) R 1 hr. 27. Min.
